Local Student Honoured for Excellence in Education

Sherwood Park – Sherwood Park resident and University of Alberta student Edward Landon Woodbeck has been awarded a \$3,000 scholarship from the Education Foundation of The Association of Professional Engineers, Geologists and Geophysicists of Alberta (APEGGA).

Woodbeck is the recipient of the APEGGA MacEwan College Transfer Scholarship, awarded on the basis of academic achievement to a student completing an engineering, geological or geophysical technology program who is continuing his or her studies at the University of Alberta or the University of Calgary.

In 2005, the APEGGA Education Foundation awarded 38 scholarships totaling \$93,000 to high school and post-secondary students from across Alberta who are pursuing a career in the professions of engineering, geology or geophysics.
